The Anatomy of College Tuition

If the real cost of a year in college is rising over a period of time that means educational costs are growing more rapidly than the inflation rate If real costs are falling, then higher education costs are growing less rapidly than inflation We should also note “educational costs” do not include auxiliary services like room and board
